Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 In 2017, 2018 and 2019 school were awarded the Silver School Gamesmark Award for inter and intra school competition. All year groups take part in inter school competition (mini-kickers, sportshall etc.). We currently take children from Year 5 and 6 swimming for a six-week block of swimming lessons. All children access two hours of curriculum Physical Education each week. In 2015 we put a 220m all-weather track in place so as to be able to complete the Cheshire Daily Mile initiative. Staff have passion and desire to be able to offer first rate sporting opportunities to all pupils, including SEND. We have been successful with a grant from Table Tennis England. This has allowed school to purchase two indoor table tennis tables and one outdoor table. 	 improved as a matter of urgency. Parents are not able to support school attending events due to being unable to drive / siblings. School equipment has become damaged and broken throughout the year, this will need replacing. School behaviour has deteriorated towards the end of the school year. Mid-day assistants need to be skilled in delivering high quality lunchtime activities.
